This is necessary so that each player in the game has the appropriate Hockey Canada insurance and to ensure that no ineligible players are participating. League and playoff games are automatically insured by Hockey Canada as they have been approved by the WAAA/OMHA. Once approved you will receive an email from Dave Garinger. You must have this with you at game/tournament

As coaches and team officials you are tasked with the responsibility of developing our community of hockey players. We are governed by the WOAA and OMHA, and as such we must follow the rules, regulation, bylaws and guidelines as set out by the various organizations. We are all responsible to keep abreast of any changes to rules, regulation, bylaws and guidelines as set out by the various organizations.

Learning in a fun, safe and prosperous environment makes everyone champions. Our primary goal is to develop hockey players.

All participants within SLMH must represent Shallow Lake Minor Hockey and the Town of Shallow Lake in good faith and good sportsmanship.

## **EMPHASIS**

- **ALL** team officials **must** have a "Volunteer Police Check" done.
- Every team official **must** have completed Respect in Sport Activity Leader/Coach Program (online course <http://respectinsport.com/activity-leader-program>) before they can be on the ice.
- The head coach is solely responsible for ensuring without further notice from anyone that the player(s) and/or team official(s) serve the minimum suspensions.
- The head coach is accountable for the actions of team officials during games.
- When calling up affiliated players, it is **mandatory that you talk to the AP's coach first!**
- Teams must ensure injury reports are completed and submitted promptly.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

- Shallow Lake Minor Hockey is taking positive steps in promoting the prevention of abuse and harassment within our Association.
- As such, use of profanity or aggression directed at a game official, executive member, team official, parent or child will not be tolerated and appropriate disciplinary action will result from these actions.
- At no time should you participate in confrontations with any parent, team official, referee, or player. Also, please refrain from using emails to discredit anyone.
- If at any time you feel you, your child, or anyone else is being threatened or harassed, remove yourself from the situation, and immediately contact the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, or any member of the SLMH Executive. They will inform you of the proper procedure to initiate the complaint.
- Code of Conduct needs to be handed back in to Team Manager by each player and signed by each parent as soon as team is chosen.
- **All players must have at least one parent complete the Respect in Sport program through OMHA. If this is not completed, the player cannot be rostered with a team, as per Hockey Canada's regulations and will not be allowed on ice after first week of October.**

## SLMH PRIVACY POLICY

- SLMH do not share personal information as we respect everyone's right to confidentiality.
- SLMH collects personal information from prospective members, coaches, referees, managers and volunteers for the purposes of conducting our Hockey Programming.
- Information specific to a player such as a player's name, address and date of birth are collected to determine that the player's geographical, division of play and level of play information are consistent with Hockey Canada/Branch regulations. Historical information concerning past teams played for is collected in order to determine if Shallow Lake Minor Hockey Association transfer regulations may apply.
- At no time are lists generated for the purpose of marketing, or the sale of information.
- Team Officials must comply with the SLMH Privacy Policy. Team lists and phone numbers are not to be shared with anyone outside of SLMH, and specifically may not be distributed to outside agencies, companies, associations or individuals.

### TEAM REGISTRATION

- Numbers rule and will be dictated and discussed by SLMH executive
- Pee Wee and under do not have to identify a goalie on a team list. This allows goalies to play out. If you identify someone on your team as a goalie, that person can only play as a goalie. Note: Anyone can play as a goalie.
- Maximum 19 players on a team. (Hockey Canada)
- All Rep teams must pay a mandatory Rep fee which is submitted to OMHA, fee is \$25/player. If paying by cheque make payable to Shallow Lake Minor Hockey.
- Team may have more than five (5) Team Officials registered on a team list. (Hockey Canada), but only five (5) Team Officials may be on the bench during a game. (Hockey Canada)
- Teams cannot be rostered unless all team staff have the required qualifications. See 2017/2018 Team Official Qualification Requirements (attached). Any required courses must be complete asap after team officials are chosen in order to ensure the team rostering process can be complete. Any questions about this process can be forwarded to Monica Blair (Registrar) or Mike Sollazzo (Coach Convener).

### AFFILIATION

- Paperwork must be 100% complete before a player may be called up for a game. (AP form attached)
- A coach at the lower level can stop a player from affiliating.
- Player priority is always given to the lower level team. If both teams are playing on the same day, the player plays for the team he is signed with.
- No player's names may be added after January 15<sup>th</sup> to an affiliate list.
- The coach may or may not invite affiliate players to practices.

## CERTIFICATION

- In order to appear on a valid team list, the person must have and provide proof of the required qualifications. Respect in Sport Activity Leader/Coach Program. Police Check, Coach, or Trainers Certificates.
- Hockey Canada states that a person must be 16 years of age in order to attend a clinic. If the Trainer's Certificate expires, the person must take the course again.
- All team staff must have a police check, including coaches, trainers and manager. Please submit completed police check to First Vice President of Shallow Lake Minor Hockey ASAP. ## COACH

- The actions of players both on and off the ice are the responsibility of the coach.
- The actions of the team officials on and off the ice are the responsibility of the coach.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to ensure that suspensions are carried out.
- Do not pull your team off the ice during a game (would result in suspension). If you are concerned about safety, ask the referee to suspend the game.

## COMMUNICATION

- Keep open the lines of communication with all team players, affiliated players and parents.
- The manager should collect a list at the beginning of each season of team member email addresses/phone numbers.
- Have a meeting at the start of the year.
- Have a team meeting before playoffs begin.
- Should game dates / practices change, ensure everyone is aware.

## GAMES

- A three (3) minute warm up will be put on the clock after the ice has been prepared. Teams are to be ready. When the three (3) minutes are over the game clock is to start.
- Teams must be dressed and ready to play fifteen (15) minutes before the scheduled game start time.
- It is the home team's responsibility to ensure referees have been scheduled via SLMH Referee-In-Chief.
- Do not leave rescheduled games until the end of the season.
- Remember to call SLMH Referee-In-Chief to re-schedule referees in the event of a game date and/or time change.
- All league games must be played, even if the standings at the end of the year are not affected.
- Sportsmanship - Teams are to shake hands before the start of all League regular season and playoff games
- The actions of players and team officials both on and off the ice are the responsibility of the coach.
- If the trainers for both teams are not present, the game will **not** be allowed to go on. (trainer can be shared should there be a verbal agreement)

## TEAM FUNCTIONS

- The only way any team is permitted to have Parent/Child on ice activities is by renting the ice yourself not through SLMH. Parent and non-player participants are required to wear a helmet.
- Team fundraising initiatives for income to the Team only must be approved by SLMHA executive.

#### REPRESENTATIVE (REP):

- AE is considered a category of Representative (Rep) hockey, under the Centre's Base Category

#### HOUSE LEAGUE (HL):

- Assistant Coaches at House League require Respect in Sport (RiS)-Activity Leader or Speak Out! and Gender Identity and Expression Course Only . However, they would require the appropriate qualification listed in chart above for participation with teams from outside their House League (i.e. exhibition and/or tournament play).
- In addition, if the Head Coach were not available to start a House League game, an appropriately NCCP qualified Coach would be required to act as the Head Coach.

## TEAM VOLUNTEERS

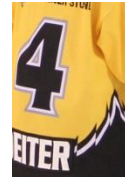
- Any person who helps out with the team has to have “Respect In Sport”
- All team officials must provide a current “Volunteer Police Check” before they are accepted on a team list.
- Any person who regularly helps out with the team should be placed on the team list as an “Assistant Manager”. This will guarantee that they are properly insured.
- Helpers who are registered as players with SLMH must wear full equipment including neck guard, and mouth guard.
- Helmet Regulations (ODMHA 13.0 (a)) any coach, trainer, assistant coach or volunteer who is on the ice at practices must wear a CSA approved hockey helmet affixed and securely fastened to their head.

## TEAM JERSEYS

- All teams require a \$200 fully refunded deposit on Jersey and locker equipment. This equipment will signed off on at the beginning of the year with the equipment Manager
- Team jerseys are the property of Shallow Lake Minor Hockey Association.
- Jerseys are to be collected by an appointed person on the team.
- Jerseys are **NOT to** be handed out to players for the season.
- Jerseys **NEED** to be cleaned on a regular basis.
- Player names can be sewn on the back lower part of the jerseys at the bottom. White name plaque on white jersey, and black name plaque on black jersey.

## JERSEY NAME BARS

- Up to the individual team bench staff if they are to be used or not.
- SL name bars are to be at bottom. Black crest with white lettering.
- Name bars must be removed by team at year end for refund



## TEAM SOCKS

- Team socks have been included with registration. Once teams have been selected the team Manager is to contact Equipment Manager with sizes and how many are needed.

## ICE SCHEDULING

- The SLMH Ice Convener is Melissa French. Please contact Melissa at [mfrench26@hotmail.com](mailto:mfrench26@hotmail.com)
- Ice not utilized costs SLMH. This translates to additional expenses to the Association.
- Make sure you have an up-to-date schedule for your team to follow.
- Coaches that are not able to utilize the ice purchased for their team **MUST** contact SLMH Ice Convener immediately, in order re-allocated the ice time.
- Managers must email their entire game schedule as soon as they receive it. This includes home AND away games.

**Zach Carson is the Facilities Coordinator. Extra ice time costs will be the responsibility of the team.**

## Cancelling Ice

- It is mandatory that 1 week notice (to Melissa) be given for ice cancellations.
- During playoffs it becomes 72 hour notice.
- If this does not happen SLMH will be invoiced for that time not used.

## **MOUTH GUARDS, NECK GUARDS & HELMETS**

- All participants (team officials) must wear a CSA approved helmet (**Sticker must be on Helmet**)
- It is mandatory for all registered OMHA players to wear mouth guards during all on ice activities (games and practices)
- It is mandatory for all registered OMHA players to wear NECK GUARDS during all on ice activities (games and practices)

## **ADMISSION TO HOME GAMES**

- All immediate player families are not required to pay admission to regular season games.
- When play-offs begin everyone is required to pay.
- Season passes are available for purchase through team Manager
- Each team has their own way of manning the gate, be it one person for the whole season, or each parent scheduled for a specific date. It is the responsibility of the manager to ensure a schedule is set up for manning the gate. The team float will be distributed to the manager who must then ensure that it is given to the next person who will need it to run the gate.
- Gate is required to be open 1 hour prior to beginning of your game.
- Effective 2016-2017, 50/50 is to be sold at all OMHA and WOAA PLAYOFF games

**All game exhibition, season or playoff is to have Referees booked through Paul Quesnel**

Team managers must email Paul Quesnel their home game schedule as soon as games are booked. If a game is cancelled, it is the responsibility of the manager to advise the Referee-In-Chief so that referees can be notified. Referees are to be paid at the door when they arrive for each game according to the 2017/18 OMHA Manual of Operations.

### **Legit Issues with Ref will be investigated if warranted, Submit in Writing to Referee in Chief & President**

- Step down off the bench when speaking to a referee.
- Move the players out of earshot. Any discussion is between you and the official.
- Stay calm, factual, and respectful.
- Work with the referee and he will work with you.
- Remember that everyone makes mistakes.

## **TIMEKEEPERS**

- Are the responsibility of the team manager for all home games. Students can be hired for this at a rate of \$10 per game (to be paid out of the team float) or they may wish to volunteer for this role in order to obtain high school volunteer hours. A list of knowledgeable timekeepers will be posted on the bulletin board in the arena lobby.

**\*\*\*\*A Gate Sheet tracking must be completed for each game that tracks the starting float, timekeeper wages, referee wages and ending float. \*\***

## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

- Attached
- Must be filled out by all team members
- Team Managers are responsible for collecting
- Forms are to be turned into 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President.

## ACCIDENT / INJURY REPORTS

This report MUST be completed by the Team Trainer when:

- a. A player required the assistance of a trainer due to an injury which resulted from the course of a hockey event.
- b. A player is taken by ambulance to hospital.
- c. If the injury will not allow the player to return to active duty based on a physician's diagnosis.
- d. If the possibility exists that there could be any expenses related directly to the injury or if a possible claim/suit could result from the injury against the OMHA insurance program.

It is the team management's responsibility to file injury reports to SLMH – President and Head Trainer Colleen Ouwendyk 519-378-4716. Parents are to assist the team management in the completion of the report as well as providing doctors notes in order for the player to be permitted back on the ice. SLMH requires that injury reports be submitted as soon as possible. Injury Report can be found on our website under "Team Staff"

A doctor's note is required along with a completed injury report before the team management is permitted to allow the player back on the ice. A parent's verbal or written consent is not adequate.

A trainer can refuse to allow any player from continuing to play in a game or practice if they have just cause. The trainer may not be overruled by any player, parent or team official. This includes the head coach.

### **Understanding Discrimination based on Gender Identity & Expression Training for Team Officials**

The Ontario Hockey Federation, are ready to roll out the Understanding Discrimination based on Gender Identity and Gender Expression and a Guide to the Dressing Room Policy and Confidentiality Statement modules that form the Gender Identity and Expression Course for all team officials, which is a mandatory requirement to be approved to a roster for the 2017-18 season.

All team officials will require an eHockey account in the Hockey Canada Registry (HCR) in order to register for and complete the two Modules. Once completed, notification will be posted to the team officials' member profile on the HCR.

The first step in completing the training is to ensure all team officials have an eHockey account, in order to sign up for the required clinic. Those who do not already have an eHockey account can click the following link to sign up:
